TRAVEL TIME DISTANCES FROM GENESEO

Avon – 5 minutes
 Rochester/Henrietta – 30-40 minutes
 Lakeville – 15 minutes

This summer program is designed to help you make a successful transition into the college community. AOP and other college personnel will be on hand to guide you through a variety of academic experiences and activities, some of which will be integrated with the College’s General Orientation. By the end of the summer program, you will (1) be registered for the fall, (2) have a good introduction to AOP and to college life and services at Geneseo, (3) know other members of the Class of 2012, (4) gain confidence about starting college in the fall, and (5) earn college credits toward your graduation requirements.

Please Note: This is a residential summer program. Participants will not be permitted to go home, use their personal cars, or ride in guest vehicles until the conclusion of the program (unless accompanied by a parent or legal guardian). Additionally, guests are allowed to visit students during the weekend of July 26, 2008, as long as the student has returned the necessary paperwork to the AOP department. Otherwise, guests are not allowed in the residential quarters of the hall nor are they allowed to stay overnight.

ADDITIONAL BENEFITS

- Individual academic counseling and advisement provided by your AOP advisor
- Small group discussions with peers
- Opportunities to meet fellow students

ACADEMIC ADVISEMENT

During this summer orientation, you will be introduced to the AOP staff and the services they provide. You will attend group advisement sessions presented by your AOP advisor, from whom you will receive your class schedule and learn about the registration process. The AOP staff and other members of the college community will also present workshops that will help you to make a successful transition to Geneseo.

STUDENT PROGRAM FEES

The fee for summer program participants is \$250/week per student (**Note:** The cost of EOP student participation will be assumed by the State's EOP grant). Fees cover all expenses, such as room, meals, resource materials and academic advisement. All fees must be received no later than June 20, 2008 (unless you opt for our payment plan; please see enclosed AOP Summer Program payment plan form). Make checks payable to "**Geneseo Foundation – AOP – Sumprg**".

STUDENT SUMMER HOUSING

Students will be housed in **Livingston Hall**, which is located on the North side of campus.

AOP PRE-TESTING & PARENT ORIENTATION

The AOP staff will administer a pre-test for the purpose of placement for all summer program participants. The testing and parent orientation will take place on the following days and times, and at the identified locations:

Each of the testing session will be followed by a parent orientation to allow parents to ask questions about the AOP Summer Program or questions about any other pertinent matters.

REFUNDS

Pro-rated refunds are possible. Emergency situations will be reviewed by the Director of AOP. There will be a 5% handling fee assessed for any refunds; deadline for requesting refunds is Friday, August 1, 2008.

WHAT TO BRING

- A laptop and a flash drive for computer use
- Financial aid paperwork or housing related concerns
- High School transcript(s) and AP scores (if available)
- Green card or alien registration card (INS verification) - a copy only
- Health Forms (unless already submitted)
- A graphic calculator (TI – 83, 86 or 89 preferred)
- Pens, pencils and a book bag
- A small fan (residence halls are not air conditioned)
- An alarm clock
- Bathing/Swim Suit (swimming trunks) and sun block
- Room linen (extra-long twin sheets), a light blanket and a pillow
- Toiletries and towels
- Ideas, enthusiasm and energy

Please Note: All students are required to bring laptops to campus for the summer. The AOP department and/or student staff cannot be responsible for its security; however, registration of computers into a federal database will be available.

CHECK IN DATE AND LOCATION

All Summer Program participants will be residing in **Livingston Hall**. Students should arrive by no later than 6:00 PM on Sunday, July 6, 2008 and plan to depart no earlier than 1:00 PM on Friday, August 8, 2008.
