Dear Colleagues,

I'm very pleased to announce the continuation of a program of support for curricular innovation during the 2013-2014 academic year. Departments and programs are invited to apply for funding in amounts up to \$20,000 to support planning and piloting of curricular revision. Funding for this innovation work comes from the seed money offered for the Six Big Ideas; up to \$160,000 will be available in this round of proposals. Up to \$20,000 of this funding will be earmarked specifically for assessment projects. The deadline for proposals will be **Tuesday, April 30, 2013**.

Applications for curricular innovation funds should explain how the project connects to college and department or program goals and plans; an application form is attached and is also available on the Provost's webpage. Funds will be awarded by May 17, 2013.

Priority will be given to applications that:

- 1) show the greatest promise for significant curricular improvement;
- 2) propose innovative use of the 4-credit course model or realignment of teaching resources;
- 3) include a plan to evaluate the effectiveness of proposed changes;
- 4) focus on one or more of the following:
 - incorporation of high-impact educational practices

 - incorporation of global and intercultural learning

 - teambuilding with other staff and faculty on campus or at a distance

The areas of innovation listed above respond to the interests of faculty as identified in our ongoing discussions, various surveys, and in the Middle States Self-Study.


Suggestions for ways funds may be used include but are not limited to:

- summer stipends for curricular revision
- readings and materials
- guest speakers or consultants
- course release for curricular revision
- retreats or meetings

Departments and programs that have had curriculum innovation grants over the past two years are: Biology, Chemistry, Communication, Education, English, General Education, Geography, Geological Sciences, History, Mathematics, Political Science, Physics and Psychology.
