## Focused Tours

**Academics:** This tour will be based on the participants' schedules so that you can locate your classrooms on the first day. Learn about the Center for Academic Excellence. Also, visit Erwin Hall, where you'll find the office of the Dean of the College, Financial Aid, Registrar, and Student Accounts.

**Athletics & Recreation:** Visit the weight rooms, locker rooms, pool, ice rink, and other facilities located in Schrader and Merritt. You'll learn about the hours, equipment, intramurals, and sports clubs. Find out how to sign up for the Workout Center, which is free to students living on campus.

**GOLD:** Learn about the various leadership education opportunities on campus and participate in a sample workshop.

**Milne Library:** Milne Library serves as the heartbeat of academics on campus. Come learn about what the library has to offer, including the newly created Digital Media Lab and the technology equipment available for students.

**Residence Life:** Tour one of the residence halls on campus and learn about the great community you will be a part of living on campus. You will be able to ask residence hall staff questions about what it is like living in residence halls and the learning opportunities offered by the Resident Assistants.

## Other things for students to do today

**ID Card.** Get your Geneseo photo ID card in Blake A 108. You'll need it for such things as getting into your residence hall, paying for meals in the dining halls, and borrowing materials from the library.

**Information Fair.** Be sure to stop into the Information Fair between 11:30am – 1:30pm. A wide variety of services from on and off campus will have tables where you can go to get information or ask questions. A sampling of categories includes banks, transportation, student employment, disability services, computing, health & counseling, interfaith groups, athletics, and student organizations.

**Mailroom.** While you are in the MacVittie College Union, look for the mailroom on the first floor. You will be assigned a mailbox number at a later date and all of your physical mail (from the college or from off-campus) will be delivered there.

**Parking Permits.** If you intend to have a car on campus in the fall as a resident or a commuter you will need a parking permit. These can be purchased at the Parking and Transportation Office located in the University Police Department, Schrader 19, between 8:00am and 4:00pm or via <https://www.geneseo.edu/pts>.
