Reading #28 (First of 2 readings): Field Day (\$1570)

We can cut out the ACE t-shirts for the BBQ. We have 3 options, approve BSU reading and vote down field day, or vote for the field day and vote down the BSU reading, or vote for the t-shirts and just get food and games for the BBQ and do the BSU reading. ACE decided to keep the T-Shirts and have BSU ask for the rest of the Def Jam Money. SEAA was gracious enough to let us use their cash grant. Would be \$2070 but because of cash grant we are only paying \$1570. It would be food from CAS for 100 people. We will purchase Games from Walmart with up to \$100. We will also purchase 150 ACE t-shirts for \$975. We will have roughly \$1000 left in the ACE budget. Food will be served from 4-5:30 pm

Reading 29 (First of 2 readings): Def Jam (\$500)

Def Jam poet will cost \$500 and we will ask SA for the rest of the money. Poetry about the Neo African American. He is half latino and his poems about race and culture. We can approve \$500 for the poet, and BSU can do a reading at SA next week. With this reading, BSU has to do a 2 reading here anyway and may not get the contract signed till after next Wednesday.

(\$995 for the field day shirts approved and \$500 for Def Jam. BSU will go to SA and put in a reading before 4pm on Thursday about the details and fees that Def jam requires.)

ACE approved \$4.80 for 120 Posters.
