

QUICK GUIDE to using ARTstor

Accessing ARTstor

Before you enter **ARTstor**, make sure that you turn OFF any pop-up blocker that you may have in your browser:

1. **Firefox**: look under Tools – Options – Content.
2. **IE**: look under Tools – Internet Options – Privacy

¹ Mac users accessing ARTstor through Innovative Proxy must have Java version 1.5 or later.

³ Macintosh users running Rosetta with Shockwave must turn off this feature in order to use ARTstor.

**If pop-ups remain blocked, look at any browser toolbar that may be installed in the browser.

To enter the **ARTstor Digital Library**, begin on the Milne Library website (<http://library.geneseo.edu/>).

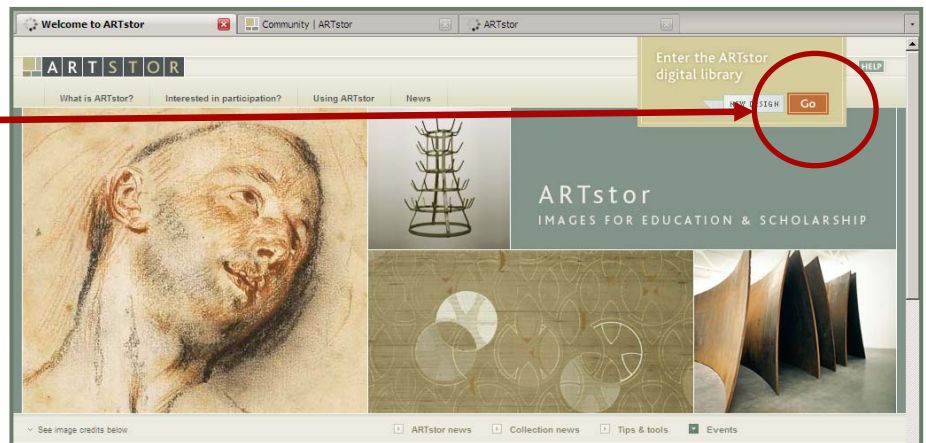
Click on the “**Resources**” tab and run a **Quicksearch** for “**ARTstor.**”

(When you access **ARTstor** from off campus, you will get a screen from the library’s proxy server that will prompt you to use your **Geneseo** email username & PW)




Choose **ARTstor** from the search results.

Click on “**Go**” to enter the database.



Register for Your ARTstor Account



1. Click on the "Not Registered?" link at the top right of the page.
2. Enter your Geneseo email address and a password of your choice.
3. Click "Submit" to have immediate access to
4. Once your account has been created, just click on "Log In" to get to the entry box.

When using ARTstor, you are subject to the Terms and Conditions of Use, which ask you to *limit use of ARTstor images to non-commercial, educational, and scholarly activities*. For example, you may download a copy of an image to use in a research paper, but you may not post that image on a website that does not have restricted access.

ARTstor Interface

Hint: Click on the logo to return to the homepage anytime.

Navigation Bar: This remains constant throughout your searching.

HELP: ArtSTOR has detailed instruction that is constantly being updated.

Begin your search with broad terms here.

Browse guides your search using Geography, Classification and Collection criteria.

This can be useful when you aren't certain what you want or how it is classified in the database.

Analyzing Image and Data Results

Sort: Click to change order of thumbnails.

Page Navigation: If there are a large number of results, you can browse the pages here.

View Image Detail: Double click on the thumbnail.

View Image Data: Double click on the subtitle.
