Choose *how* you want to search:
Broadly with Keyword
or
Specific with Subject.

Advanced Search >

Not sure if the articles call what you need "criticism"?

Criti* will return results such as: critic, critical, critique, as well as criticism.

Search for: keyword
and subject
and keyword

Advanced Search Tips

How to Enter Terms

Enter each term in a separate search box; More than one term typed per search box will be interpreted as a phrase. Use the Boolean menu; AND/OR/NOT typed into the search fields will be ignored.

Exact Phrase

Conduct exact phrase searches by using double-quotes (""). This is useful for names and exact phrases: e.g. "alfred hitchcock"

Wildcard/Stemming

Broaden your search by using an asterisk (*): *haunt** will find haunts, haunted, haunting . . . Use the asterisk to also find word variations such as singular and plural forms of a word: e.g. *director** will find director and directors.

Using Filters

Selecting filters will further narrow your results. All filters are set to "search all" by default.

Filter by Year

By default, all publication years will be searched. Narrow your results by searching one year or a range: e.g. 1958 (*one year*) or 1958 To 1960 (*range*)

Filter by Document Features

Certain articles are of a special type such as biographies, interviews, obituaries and so on.

You don't need to use *all* of the possible filters. Be flexible, and selective. Try different configurations.

Format: [film/tv]

Document Type: articles
