Greg answered some questions raised last week. On the team nights, the teams will just be going to Applebee's for dinner. Baseball decided to leave on Sunday morning so they will be able to save 1 night of hotel cost. They also found an Avis sponsorship program where they waive the \$25 under-25 fee. They will be able to save \$300 from that. They also have accident coverage of up to \$3,000.

Questions:

Adam asked for clarification on the van situation. Greg said they will be renting two vans, making two trips with one of the vans to get all the players. Tamara asked Greg if it was not a 12person van. Greg clarified that it was not. Brendan asked if they were rental cars. Greg answered that they will be renting vans from Avis. Kate asked if they looked into hired driver service like Humza asked. Greg answered that they had not. Brendan asked if these changes with transportation and leaving early would change the cost. Greg said that it lowers it but the requested allocation will still stay the same since SA does not cover two types of transportation. Nick asked if Baseball looked into staying at hotels that are closer to the fields. Greg said that they had but they were more expensive. Kate asked how many games Baseball was planning to play. Greg said that they will be playing 6 games and 1 practice. They will be doing two double headers and 2 singles games but they have not finalized the schedules on when they are playing these games. Tamara asked if Baseball considered taking an advisor with them. Greg said that their advisor Ken Cooper knows about the tournament but they did not ask him to go with them. Tamara asked if they would consider asking him to come. Greg said that they would if that would make SA more comfortable. Tamara said that if an advisor is there, it shares the liability. Tamara asked if the players know that they will be still under student code of conduct while they are in Florida. Greg said that they did.

Discussion:

Nick said he appreciated Baseball for working hard to keep costs down. They also worked patiently with SA but he expressed concern since there is a lot of liability. However, he feels that it will be a great experience. Adam also commended Baseball for working hard for the past few weeks to put this reading together. Greg kept in contact with Adam and Kate throughout the process. Although they worked hard, it is not an automatic approval. He also expressed concern due to the liability issue and a lack of advisor. Humza from Model UN mentioned that Baseball should look into for hire service since it may be more cost effective and would lessen the liability. Jarah agreed but she said the liability issue also comes from the fact that they will be in Florida during Spring Break. Diana said she is uncomfortable with it due to the liability issue.

22-0708, second of two readings, passed 4-2-0, with Jarah, Chad, Vinita, and Nick voting yes and Adam and Diana voting no.

New Business

26-0708: BE IT RESOLVED THE SA EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE approve the Intercultural Dinner fundraiser of Student Association, Account 1002 on 27 October to raise up to \$1,750.00 for the charity "Doctors Without Borders".

First and only reading

Jason said that with Nick, he decided on the charity to donate the proceeds from Intercultural Dinner. They decided on "Doctors Without Borders" since it is neutral to ethnicity, race, gender, sexual orientation, etc. It is capped at \$1750, which is the max profit they can make from tickets sales (general admission price of \$7 times 250 attendees).

Question:

Jarah asked Jason if he was aware about the deposit policy that must be strictly followed. Within 10 days after any fundraising event, documentation of the deposits to charitable contributions or proceeds must be submitted to CU&A. Jason answered that he was aware of the policy.

Discussion:

Jarah said that the Intercultural Dinner is a well liked event and she hopes they can raise a lot of money since it's for a great cause.
