SUNY Geneseo is in the Finger Lakes region of NY – just a short drive from Upstate's largest cities, Buffalo and Rochester. Located on 220 acres in the Village of Geneseo, the campus offers a uniquely warm, welcoming environment. Adjacent to the College, Main Street is prized for its mid-19th-century architecture. Letchworth State Park, the "Grand Canyon of the East," is just a few miles from campus. Enjoy lakes, rolling hills, skiing, and hiking all in our backyard.

STUDENT TRANSPORTATION RESOURCES

Students have access to bus service around the Village of Geneseo, with weekend shuttles to the nearby city of Rochester. Taxi services and student ride shares are also available. Each semester, the ISSS staff will pick up new incoming students at the Rochester Airport free of charge.





APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Admission decisions are based primarily on academic records and examinations. Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis.

DEADLINES: Fall semester: February 1 Spring semester: December 1

Required application documents include:

- A completed SUNY Application or Common Application
- Official academic records (including high school transcripts or senior secondary exam results for freshman applicants, or official university transcripts for transfer applicants)
- Proof of English proficiency - TOEFL 75, IELTS 6.5, or equivalent
- · One letter of recommendation
- · A brief personal statement
- Financial statement of support
- Copy of ID page of passport

Application materials can be submitted to <code>isss@geneseo.edu</code> but official documents are required by the time of enrollment.

Advanced standing is possible for students who complete the International Baccalaureate Program, Advanced Placement Exams, GCE A or AS Levels, and other post-secondary programs.

INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Some international students will qualify for academic scholarships. Academic merit scholarships are available and range from \$1,000 to \$9,000 per year.

STUDENT EMPLOYMENT

Many international students pursue on-campus employment opportunities with Campus Auxilliary Services (CAS) or one of the many academic or administrative offices around campus. Students have also received academic assistantships as well as paid summer research opportunities to gain valuable real-world experience and further reduce the cost of attendance.

INTERNSHIPS AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Upper-level students gain meaningful field experience with public agencies and private companies through the School of Business' Internship Program. It provides opportunities for students to link theory with practice in real-world experiences.

Geneseo's Business School students participate in internships with well-known organizations such as NASDAQ, JP Morgan, and others to gain real-world experience.

The Geneseo Opportunities for Leadership Development (GOLD) program prepares students for leadership roles through an extensive series of personal development programs, service learning, volunteer work, and engagement in college and community life. Sixty percent of Geneseo students have participated in GOLD leadership seminars.

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH

Forty-one percent of SUNY Geneseo students have conducted a research project and 70% of faculty report having worked with undergraduates on research. Geneseo's annual GREAT Day (Geneseo Recognizing Excellence, Achievement, and Talent) is a college-wide symposium that celebrates the creative and scholarly endeavors of more than 1,000 students.
