If you are registered to vote in Geneseo on or before March 8th, 2024, you are eligible to vote in the **Village Election on Tuesday, March 19th, 2024.** If you are registered to vote outside of Geneseo, contact your Board of Elections for specific information on local elections in your home county. To look up the contact information for your home Board of Elections, <u>click here.</u>

# **2024 Village Election Information:**

- On Tuesday, March 19th, the Village Election will occur from **Noon to 9:00 pm EST**.
- To check if you are registered to vote in Geneseo, click here.
  - \*IMPORTANT:
    - If you are registered to vote outside of Geneseo, you are not eligible to vote in this election.
    - If you registered to vote in Geneseo after March 8th, 2024, you are not eligible to vote in this
      election.
- If you plan to be in Geneseo on Election Day, **vote in person**. If you are away from Geneseo during the election, **vote by absentee ballot**.

#### **How to Vote:**

#### \*\*Voting in Geneseo\*\*

- You may vote in person on Tuesday, March 19th, 2024:
  - Off-campus students: Depending on your address, you will vote at St. Mary's Parish Center (District 1), 13 North Street, or United Methodist Church (District 2). The election district map for Geneseo is available at this link: Geneseo Election Districts. You can also call the Board of Elections at (585) 243-7090 to locate your poll site.
  - On-campus students: If your voting address is on-campus (District 3), you are assigned to vote at MacVittie College Union Ballroom Lounge.

# \*\*Voting by Absentee Ballot\*\*

- To vote via Absentee Ballot, you must first apply for your ballot.
  - If the Livingston County Board of Elections received your application on or before March 4th, you should have received your absentee ballot in the mail at your residence in Geneseo (or on-campus mailbox).
  - O Here are three ways to return your ballot:
    - **By mail:** Follow the instructions provided for your ballot.
      - \*IMPORTANT: To ensure your vote is counted, mailed absentee ballot envelopes
        must be postmarked no later than the day before the election, Monday, March 18,
        2024
    - In person at the Livingston County Board of Elections office: <u>Livingston County</u> Government Center (6 Court <u>St</u>, <u>Geneseo</u>, <u>NY</u>).
    - In person at your Geneseo polling place on Election Day: Tuesday, March 19, 2024. To find your Election Day polling location, click here.
  - \*NOTE: If you applied for an absentee ballot after March 4th, you will not receive an absentee ballot in the mail. Read the following bullet point for directions on how to apply in person.

- If you applied for an absentee ballot after March 4th or have yet to apply and would still like to vote via absentee ballot, you must complete and deliver an application in person.
  - \*IMPORTANT: Monday, March 18th (3/18) is the last day to personally deliver an application for an absentee ballot to the Board of Elections.
    - If you still want to vote by Absentee Ballot, you (the applicant) or an applicant's agent must deliver all absentee ballot applications to the Livingston County Board of Elections on or before March 18th, located in the <a href="Government Building">Government Building</a> (6 Court St. Geneseo, NY).
    - The Board of Elections will process absentee ballot applications on Monday (March 18th) from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.
