#### Comments on the 2024-25 Annual Report of the Office of Sponsored Research

**Traditional Funding Activities:** In 2024-25 we reached \$3,101,462 for total new awards, which was the result of 15 awards to 20 faculty PIs and co-PIs in 9 academic departments and 2 offices/centers. This is the 4th highest dollar amount of annual awards in the last 25 years. During the 2024-25 year, 44 faculty and staff members in 17 departments/offices submitted 36 proposals totaling \$11,972,142 in requests. Total grant expenditures for our 25 active Research Foundation for SUNY projects reached \$2,419,724; the second highest amount ever. This is the fourth year in a row that our Research Foundation for SUNY expenditures have exceeded \$2 million.

Access Opportunity Programs received a new award from the New York State Education Department's Collegiate Science and Technology Entry Program (CSTEP) and had continuing support from the U. S. Department of Education for our TRIO Student Support Services and Ronald E. McNair Postbaccalaureate Achievement programs. The Biology Department was awarded continuing support from the Livingston County Board of Supervisors and had continuing support from the National Science Foundation (NSF) through the Research in Undergraduate Institutions (RUI), Building Research Capacity in Biology (BRC-BIO), Research Coordination Networks in Undergraduate Biology Education (RCN-UBE), and Scholarships in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics Program (S-STEM) programs.

A School of Business faculty member received a Fulbright US Scholar Award for the Sultan Qaboos University's College of Economics and Political Science in Oman.

The Career Design Center received funding from SUNY for a Paid Internship Community of Practice (CoP).

The Department of Chemistry & Biochemistry had continuing support from the NSF Improving Undergraduate STEM Education (IUSE) and ADVANCE: Organizational Change for Gender Equity in STEM Academic Professions (ADVANCE) program and received a new collaborative research award from the NSF IUSE: Innovation in Two-Year College STEM Education (ITYC) program.

The School of Education received new awards from the NEA Foundation and the Library of Congress as well as a new award from the United Way of Greater Rochester and the Finger Lakes for the continuation of the Soaring Stars Summer Program.

The Department of Geological, Environmental, and Planetary Sciences, in collaboration with George Mason University, Texas A&M, and the University of Maryland, received a new collaborative research award from the NSF had continued support from the NSF Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship Program

The History Department received a prestigious Mellon Foundation Award for Social Justice and the Humanities and had continuing support from the Teagle Foundation and the Rodert David Lion Gardiner Foundation

Milne Library had continued support from the N.Y. State Education Department for Library Collection Aid and ongoing support from the Institute of Museum and Library Services.

The Department of Philosophy and the Department of Political Science & International Relations collaborated to receive two Constitution Day Event awards from the Jack Miller Center.

The Department of Physics and Astronomy received continuing support from the U.S. Department of Energy through the University of Rochester's Laboratory for Laser Energetics as well as a new US Fullbright Scholar Award for the University College Dublin in the Republic of Ireland. The Department also had continuing support from Cornell University through the NASA Space Grant program and from the NSF Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship and Research in Undergraduate Institutions (RUI) programs.

During 2024-25 we continued our relationship with McAllister & Quinn (M&Q), whose staff members worked with us on proposals submitted to the Mellon Foundation, the New York State Collegiate

Science and Technology Entry (CSTEP) program and the National Science Foundation's Improving Undergraduate STEM Education, Major Research Instrumentation (MRI), and Growing Research Access for Nationally Transformative Economic Development (GRANTED) programs.

**Internal Funding:** In collaboration with the Geneseo Foundation, the Research Foundation for SUNY, and the Offices of Accounting and Grants Management, the Research Council reviewed applications from faculty members and students that resulted in 425 individual awards with a total value of \$359,139. Total internal funding for our formal grant and fellowship programs, combined with other planned support for research and scholarly activities, amounted to \$412,336.

**GREAT Day:** On April 23, 2025, we were able to hold the 19<sup>th</sup> annual GREAT Day in person. GREAT Day was administered by Faculty Chair Lytton Smith, Department of English, Faculty Co-Chair Pallavi Panda, School of Business, Director of Campus Events & Scheduling Andrea Klein and Director of Sponsored Research Anne Baldwin. The Music Festival was coordinated by Kara Cornell, Department of Music, and the Art Exhibit was coordinated by Dan DeZarn, Office of Sustainability. Alexis Clifton, Director of the Teaching and Learning Center, and Daniel Ross, Head of Access Services for Milne Library, coordinated the opening reception. We utilized the conference platform Oxford Abstract again this year, which was used for abstract submissions, event scheduling, and the online program for attendees. We also provided CAS gift cards to participants in lieu of the traditional buffet lunch. GREAT Day 2025 was an excellent success with a total of 665 students participating in 141 session presentations, 142 poster presentations, and 15 art, music, dance, film, and other special presentations under the mentorship of 119 faculty/staff sponsors and session chairs. 







#### RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT AND SUPPORT PROGRAMS 2024-25

The Research Council offers a wide range of programs to support research development and scholarly and creative activity.

#### **Programs for Faculty Members**

- **Presidential Summer Fellowships** provide untenured faculty with an opportunity to participate in scholarly activities and establish an ongoing research program. Up to six \$3,500 stipends are awarded annually from funds provided by the College.
- Geneseo Foundation Summer Fellowships and the Roemer Summer Fellowship support the research and creative projects of faculty who have been awarded tenure. These fellowships are intended to enable completion of a significant project or to embark in a new direction. The \$4,000 Geneseo Foundation Summer Fellowships are funded by the Geneseo Foundation, and the \$5,000 Roemer award is supported by an endowment gift to the Geneseo Foundation from the late Dr. Spencer Roemer.
- **Proposal Writing Support Awards** provide full-time faculty members with time and other forms of support to write proposals requesting at least \$15,000 in funding for submission to external funding agencies. Faculty members may request support for the writing of either: 1) new proposals, or 2) significant revisions of previously submitted proposals. Support will be considered for major proposals in all academic fields and for a variety of initiatives (e.g. fellowships, research grants, or educational grants). The maximum individual award is \$4,145, one course reassignment, or \$2,500 for summer salary. Collaborative submissions are also supported. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Research Development Awards provide support for a wide variety of needs associated with developing research and scholarly projects. Maximum award is \$1,000 or one course reassignment. Funded by the College.
- Indirect Cost Return Awards return part of the indirect costs to the project director for research expenses not covered by budgeted costs. Funded by the College.
- **Incentive Grants** are intended to encourage and support faculty initiatives in research and to fund pilot studies, completion of manuscripts, data analyses, bibliographic or archival searches, and creative work. Travel to archives, libraries, and laboratories is also supported. Awards are limited to \$1,000, but faculty may request an additional \$500 to support the cost of involving a student in the proposed project. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Faculty Travel Grants** are made to participants in professional meetings. Maximum annual awards are \$1,000 for travel within the U.S. (excluding Hawaii) and Canada, and \$1,200 for travel to Hawaii or outside the U.S. and Canada. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Pre-Tenure Faculty Research Support Awards were established to assist tenure-track
  faculty whose research and scholarly work has been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
  Tenure-track faculty who have not yet submitted their tenure package are eligible for a base
  amount of \$250, but may request an additional \$250 if needed. Total award amounts are
  generally limited to \$500, but if program funds remain after two deadlines, then an additional
  deadline is announced. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Page Charge allocations cover the costs of faculty publications in journals with mandatory page charges. Funded by the College.

#### **Programs for Students**

- Undergraduate Travel, Research, and Creativity (TRAC) Grants support student research
  and conference participation in conjunction with a faculty member. Maximum awards are \$600
  per student per semester or \$1,800 per group per semester. Funded by the Student
  Association and the Geneseo Foundation.
- Dr. Denise Battles and Dr. Michael Mills Endowment for Student Research Awards
  recognize exemplary applications to the TRAC Grants program. All applications to the TRAC
  Grants program will be considered for these awards, which will be given instead of a TRAC
  Grant. Similarly to TRAC Grants, maximum awards are \$600 per student per semester or
  summer (\$1,800 maximum per groups of three or more students). They are funded by an
  endowment created by Dr. Denise Battles and Dr. Michael Mills.
- **Graduate Student Research and Travel Grants** support graduate student research and conference participation in conjunction with a faculty member. Maximum awards are \$600 per student per semester. Funded by the College.
- The Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes Research Award supports undergraduate student research or field study. Preference is given to scholarly research combining a natural science and a social science such as biology/sociology or geology/ anthropology. The awardee is chosen from among successful Geneseo Foundation Undergraduate Summer Research Fellowship and Geneseo Foundation Research Assistantship applicants. The maximum award is \$600. Funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an endowment established by Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes.
- **Dean Johnston and Geneseo Foundation Student Research Assistantships** provide faculty members with research assistants for their scholarly projects. Undergraduate students receive a stipend of \$1,000. Funded through an endowment established by CPAC, Inc.
- **Undergraduate Summer Fellowships** provide a \$3,000 (full-time) or \$1,000 (part-time) stipend for students to undertake a research or creative project under the direction of a faculty member. Students must devote to their project either two consecutive summer months of effort for full-time awards or approximately 3 weeks (which may be spread across the summer) for part-time awards. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Jason and Diana Kyrwood '95 Student/Faculty Research Endowed Fellowship in Honor of Ellen Kintz provides \$2,500 plus an additional \$500 (\$3,000 total) for a stipend for an undergraduate student to work with a faculty member in the social sciences on an existing research project. Recipients must devote two consecutive summer months to the project. Funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an endowment established by Jason and Diana Kyrwood in honor of emerita faculty member Ellen Kintz.
- Sorrell Chesin '58 Research Award provides financial support to recognize students who
  have successfully undertaken a research experience in the physical and natural sciences and
  related disciplines under the direction or mentorship of a faculty member in the field of study
  and to promote this research experience. Funded by an endowment established by Sorrell
  Chesin '58.




