TOTAL: 30-39 CREDITS

A full-time student (12 credit hours per semester/summer) can finish in three semesters (both summer sessions count as one semester):

- Fall/Spring/Summer
- Summer/Fall/Spring
- Spring/Summer/Fall

Courses are set so that students would not have to take summer courses, but they still would need to take three semesters; e.g., Fall/Spring/Fall. Classes are conveniently offered late afternoon/evenings.
