#### Comments on the 2022-23 Annual Report of the Office of Sponsored Research

Traditional Funding Activities: In 2022-23 we reached \$2,589,223 for total new awards, which was the result of 10 awards to 15 faculty PIs and co-PIs in 4 academic departments and 3 offices/centers. This is the 5th highest dollar amount of annual awards in the last 23 years. During the 2022-23 year, 32 faculty and staff members submitted 26 proposals totaling \$5,581,119 in requests. Total grant expenditures for our 34 active projects reached \$2,503,603—\$9,386 in one State account award and \$2,494,217 for 33 active projects administered through the Research Foundation for SUNY. This is the second time our Research Foundation for SUNY expenditures have exceeded \$2 million and this is an all-time record for the College.

In the State of New York-funded programs, Milne Library received continuing support from the New York State Education Department. In SUNY programs, the Provost's Office received new funding from SUNY High Needs Program – Microcredentials, and the continuing support for the Computational Analytics Cluster from the SUNY Empire Innovation Fund was expended. The Center for Integrative Learning received ongoing support from the Northern Border Regional Commission.

Access Opportunity Programs' TRIO Ronald E. McNair Postbaccalaureate Achievement Program was awarded for five more years of funding from the US Department of Education and the SUNY Geneseo Student Support Services Program is receiving ongoing funding from the US Department of Education.

The Biology Department received ongoing support from the Livingston County Board of Supervisors, National Marine Sanctuary Foundation (NOAA), National Institute of Allergy & Infectious Disease, and National Science Foundation (NSF) Research Coordination Networks in Undergraduate Biology Education (RCN-UBE) Program, and NSF Supporting Academically Talented STEM Undergraduates with Scholarships (S-STEM) Program. It received new funding from NSF's RCN-UBE Program in collaboration with University of San Diego and the NSF Building Research Capacity of New Faculty in Biology (RC-BIO) Program. Chemistry faculty had continuing support from two NSF awards. The first, which has a co-PI in the Department of Political Science and International Relations, is an ADVANCE: Organizational Change for Gender Equity in STEM Academic Professions award and the second is an Improving Undergraduate Science Education (IUSE) award.

The School of Education received new and continuing awards from the United Way of Greater Rochester and the Finger Lakes and the Rochester Area Community Foundation's (RACF) Feinbloom Supporting Foundation, and a new award from EnCompass: Resources for Learning.

Faculty in Geological Sciences and Education received continuing funding for Geneseo's 5-year NSF Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship Program. Geological Sciences had continuing support from NASA Goodard Space Flight Center and NASA Headquarters. Faculty in the History Department received continuing funding for awards from the Robert David Lion Gardiner Foundation and the National Endowment for the Humanities American Rescue Plan.

Faculty in the Philosophy Department received continued funding from the Philosophy Learning and Teaching Organization (PLATO) in support of the Geneseo Summer Institute in Justice and Ethics in Modern America.

The Department of Physics and Astronomy was awarded one new NSF Research in Undergraduate Institutions (RUI) grant and had continuing support from: the U.S. Department of Energy through the University of Rochester's Laboratory for Laser Energetics; the NSF Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship Program; NSF astronomy research in collaboration with the University of Indiana; and NASA through Cornell University's Space Grant.

In addition to the ongoing NSF ADVANCE program support noted above, the Political Science and International Relations Department had ongoing support from the Jack Miller Center awards to continue the Forum on Constitutionalism and Democracy and a faculty member from the department was awarded a fellowship from the James Madison Program in American Ideals and Institutions at Princeton University.

The Psychology Department continued research supported by two Academic Research Enhancement (AREA) awards from the National Institute on Drug Abuse and the National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke.

Student Health and Counseling was awarded a Truth Initiative grant and the University Police Department had continuing funding for a U.S. Department of Justice grant.

During 2022-23 we continued our relationship with McAllister & Quinn (M&Q), whose staff members worked with us on proposals submitted to the Office on Violence Against Women/U.S. Dept. of Justice, NSF Major Research Instrumentation (2 submissions), NSF Research in Undergraduate Institutions (RUI), and NIH Academic Research Enhancement Award (AREA) programs.

**Internal Funding:** In collaboration with the Geneseo Foundation, the Research Foundation for SUNY, and the Offices of Accounting and Grants Management, the Research Council reviewed applications from faculty members and students that resulted in 392 individual awards with a total value of \$327,328. Total internal funding for our formal grant and fellowship programs, combined with other planned expenditures in support of research and scholarly activities, amounted to \$383,476.

**GREAT Day:** On April 26, 2023, we were able to hold the 17<sup>th</sup> annual GREAT Day in person. GREAT Day was administered by Director of the Center for Integrative Learning Melanie Medeiros, Director of Campus Events & Scheduling Andrea Klein and Director of Sponsored Research Anne Baldwin. The Music Festival was coordinated by Monica Hershberger, Assistant Professor of Music. Alexis Clifton, Interim Director of the Teaching and Learning Center, and Daniel Ross, Head of Access Services for Fraser Library, coordinated the opening reception. We utilized the conference platform Oxford Abstract again this year, which was used for abstract submissions, event scheduling, and the online program for attendees. We also provided CAS gift cards to participants in lieu of the traditional buffet lunch. GREAT Day 2023 was an excellent success with a total of 687 students participating in 195 session presentations, 132 poster presentations, and 41 art, music, dance, and other special presentations under the mentorship of 128 faculty/staff sponsors and session chairs. Details on GREAT Day can be found on pages 24 and 25.







#### RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT AND SUPPORT PROGRAMS 2022-23

The Research Council offers a wide range of programs to support research development and scholarly and creative activity.

#### **Programs for Faculty Members**

- **Presidential Summer Fellowships** provide untenured faculty with an opportunity to participate in scholarly activities and establish an ongoing research program. Up to six \$3,500 stipends are awarded annually from funds provided by the College.
- Geneseo Foundation Summer Fellowships and the Roemer Summer Fellowship support the research and creative projects of faculty who have been awarded tenure. These fellowships are intended to enable completion of a significant project or to embark in a new direction. The \$4,000 Geneseo Foundation Summer Fellowships are funded by the Geneseo Foundation, and the \$5,000 Roemer award is supported by an endowment gift to the Geneseo Foundation from the late Dr. Spencer Roemer.
- Proposal Writing Support Awards provide full-time faculty members with time and other forms of support to write proposals requesting at least \$15,000 in funding for submission to external funding agencies. Faculty members may request support for the writing of either: 1) new proposals, or 2) significant revisions of previously submitted proposals. Support will be considered for major proposals in all academic fields and for a variety of initiatives (e.g. fellowships, research grants, or educational grants). The maximum individual award is \$3,750, one course reassignment, or \$2,500 for summer salary. Collaborative submissions are also supported. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Research Development Awards provide support for a wide variety of needs associated
  with developing research and scholarly projects. Maximum award is \$1,000 or one course
  reassignment. Funded by the College.
- **Indirect Cost Return Awards** return part of the indirect costs to the project director for research expenses not covered by budgeted costs. Funded by the College.
- Incentive Grants are intended to encourage and support faculty initiatives in research and to fund pilot studies, completion of manuscripts, data analyses, bibliographic or archival searches, and creative work. Travel to archives, libraries, and laboratories is also supported. Awards are limited to \$1,000, but faculty may request an additional \$500 to support the cost of involving a student in the proposed project. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Faculty Travel Grants are made to participants in professional meetings. Maximum annual awards are \$800 for travel within the U.S. (excluding Hawaii) and Canada, and \$1,000 for travel to Hawaii or outside the U.S. and Canada. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Pre-Tenure Faculty Research Support Awards were established to assist tenure-track
  faculty whose research and scholarly work has been impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
  Tenure-track faculty who have not yet submitted their tenure package are eligible for a
  base amount of \$250, but may request an additional \$250 if needed. Total award amounts
  are generally limited to \$500, but if program funds remain after two deadlines, then an
  additional deadline is announced. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Page Charge allocations cover the costs of faculty publications in journals with mandatory page charges. Funded by the College.

#### **Programs for Students**

- Undergraduate Travel, Research, and Creativity (TRAC) Grants support student research and conference participation in conjunction with a faculty member. Maximum awards are \$600 per student per semester or \$1,800 per group per semester. Funded by the Student Association and the Geneseo Foundation.
- Graduate Student Research and Travel Grants support graduate student research and conference participation in conjunction with a faculty member. Maximum awards are \$600 per student per semester. Funded by the College.
- The Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes Research Award supports undergraduate student research or field study. Preference is given to scholarly research combining a natural science and a social science such as biology/sociology or geology/ anthropology. The awardee is chosen from among successful Geneseo Foundation Undergraduate Summer Research Fellowship and Geneseo Foundation Research Assistantship applicants. The maximum award is \$600. Funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an endowment established by Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes.
- Dean Johnston and Geneseo Foundation Student Research Assistantships provide faculty members with research assistants for their scholarly projects. Undergraduate students receive a stipend of \$1,000. Funded through an endowment established by CPAC, Inc.
- Undergraduate Summer Fellowships provide a \$3,000 (full-time) or \$1,000 (part-time) stipend for students to undertake a research or creative project under the direction of a faculty member. Students must devote to their project either two consecutive summer months of effort for full-time awards or approximately 3 weeks (which may be spread across the summer) for part-time awards. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Jason and Diana Kyrwood '95 Student/Faculty Research Endowed Fellowship in
  Honor of Ellen Kintz provides \$2,500 plus an additional \$500 (\$3,000 total) for a stipend
  for an undergraduate student to work with a faculty member in the social sciences on an
  existing research project. Recipients must devote two consecutive summer months to the
  project. Funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an endowment established by Jason
  and Diana Kyrwood in honor of emerita faculty member Ellen Kintz.
- Sorrell Chesin '58 Research Award provides financial support to recognize students who
  have successfully undertaken a research experience in the physical and natural sciences
  and related disciplines under the direction or mentorship of a faculty member in the field of
  study and to promote this research experience. Funded by an endowment established by
  Sorrell Chesin '58.




