## Comments on the 2012 – 2013 Annual Report of the Office of Sponsored Research

**Traditional Funding Activities:** The number of external proposal submissions reached an all-time high this year. Thirty-eight faculty and staff members from eighteen different departments generated 57 submissions, and awards received during the year totaled \$808,595. Grant expenditures for our 32 active projects were \$832,537, \$757,645 through the Research Foundation for SUNY and \$74,892 through state accounts

The Chemistry Department's U.S. Department of Energy award provided continuing support for the Molecular Structure Lab. A new National Science Foundation grant for collaborative research in the Henry Mountains of Utah was awarded to Geological Sciences faculty, adding to existing research support from four other NSF grants. Faculty members in the Department of Physics and Astronomy continued research and educational programs with on-going funding from the Physics Teacher Education Coalition, the U.S. Department of Energy (through the Laboratory for Laser Energetics, University of Rochester), NASA (through Cornell University), and the National Science Foundation (NSF). The Psychology Department also had on-going support from NIH for neuroscience research. A gift of three Nvidia Tesla M2070 GPU computing processors from Xyratex Technology Limited supported the Distributed Systems Lab in Computer Science. A new award to the Biology Department from the Livingston County Planning Department will support Conesus Lake invasive species monitoring. Continued funding through two National Institutes of Health (NIH) awards also supported biology research during the year.

A faculty member in Communication received a Fulbright Teaching and Research Award to Lithuania for the 2013-14 year. English Department faculty received a Fulbright-Hays Seminar Abroad award for travel to China and, through the University of Vermont, a new National Endowment for the Humanities award for Summer Seminar support.

Proposals to SUNY central and the Research Foundation for SUNY resulted in a significant amount of support. Faculty and staff from Milne Library, Residence Life and the Departments of English, Languages and Literatures, and Psychology received a total of eight SUNY Innovative Instruction Technology Grants (IITG) awards, five in the 2012 round and three in the 2013 round. Faculty members in Chemistry and Sociology received awards from the UWI-SUNY Seed Fund for the Development of Joint Research or Instructional Proposals, which support planning visits between SUNY and campuses of the University of West Indies. An award to the Physics Department from the SUNY RF Sustainability Fund provides partial support for a wind turbine for the planned eGarden. An award to the Department of Languages and Literatures from the SUNY Office of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion will support an undergraduate forum, "First World Diaspora," in spring, 2014.

The School of Education continued to receive substantial funding for summer outreach programs this year. Working with the Greater Rochester Summer Learning Association, with additional funds from the Max and Marian Farash Charitable Foundation and continued funding from the Rochester City School District, the Rochester Young Scholars Academy expanded this year's "Zombies are Coming!" emergency preparedness summer camp program to include 80 students. In addition, the "Soaring Stars" summer program for rural K-6 students expanded to include a second cohort of students with a combination of new support from the Rochester Area Community Foundation, Seneca Foods, and the Rotary Club of Geneseo, and continuing support from a three-year commitment from the Marie C. and Joseph C. Wilson Foundation and the Genesee Valley Educational Partnership.

**Internal Funding:** In collaboration with the Geneseo Foundation and the Offices of Accounting and Grants Management, the Research Council awarded 369 individual faculty and student grants and fellowships totaling \$317,857—the highest amount in Geneseo's history. Supported by funds from the Research Foundation for SUNY and the Geneseo Foundation, the Research Council was able to award seven STEM Undergraduate Research Fellowships for summer 2013. Total internal funding for our formal grant and fellowship programs, combined with other planned expenditures in support of research and scholarly activities, amounted to more than \$347,000.

**GREAT Day:** Geneseo's seventh annual GREAT Day was a tremendous success, setting new records with 965 students participating in 567 presentations, performances and exhibits. Dava Sobel, former New York Times science reporter and author of *Longitude*, *Galileo's Daughter*, *The Planets*, and *A More Perfect Heaven*, presented the fifth annual keynote address supported by the Jack '76 and Carol '76 Kramer Endowed Lectureship. Her address, "Bringing Copernicus to Life in Prose and Script," included readings of selected scenes from her stage play about sixteenth-century astronomer Nicolaus Copernicus, *And the Sun Stood Still*.

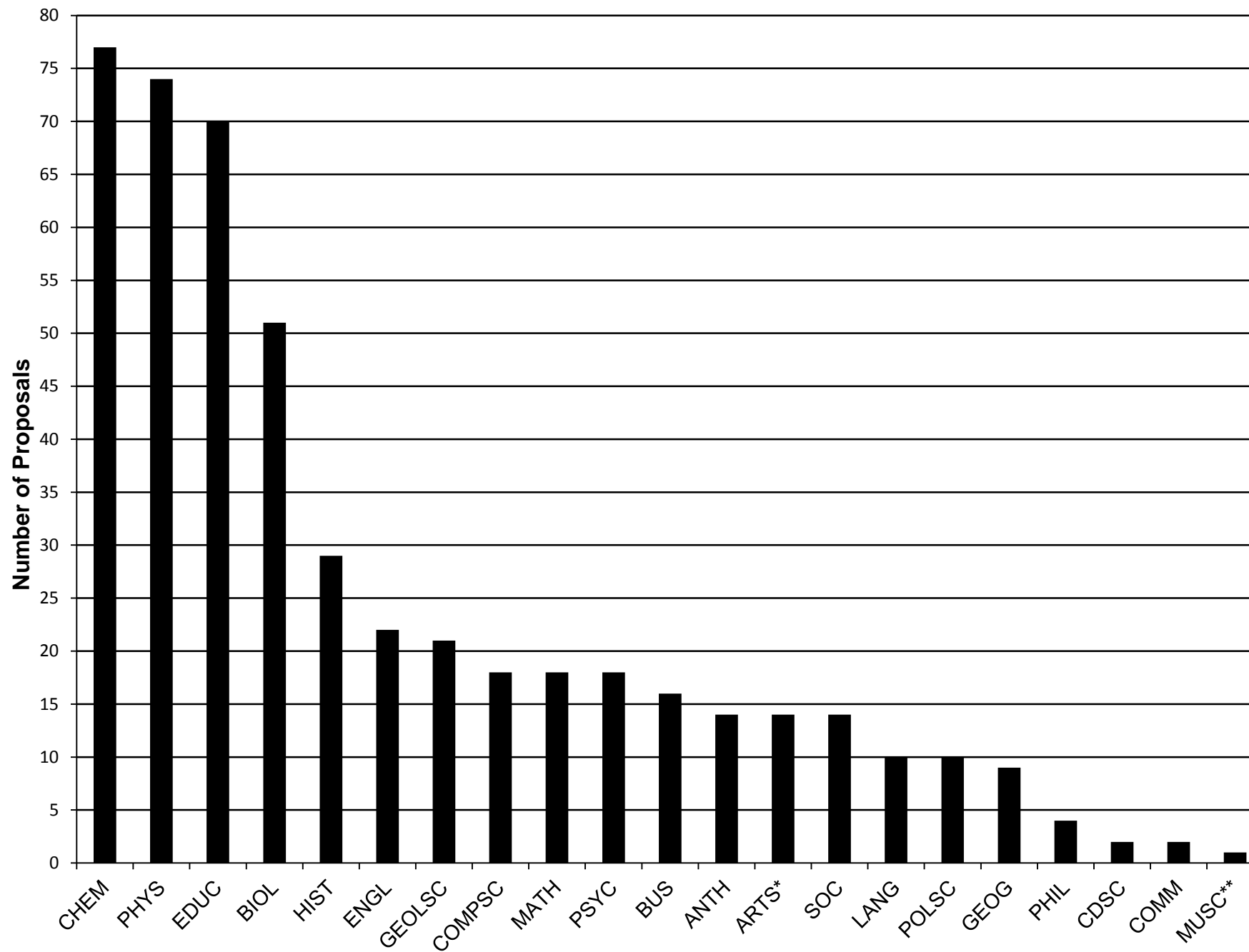

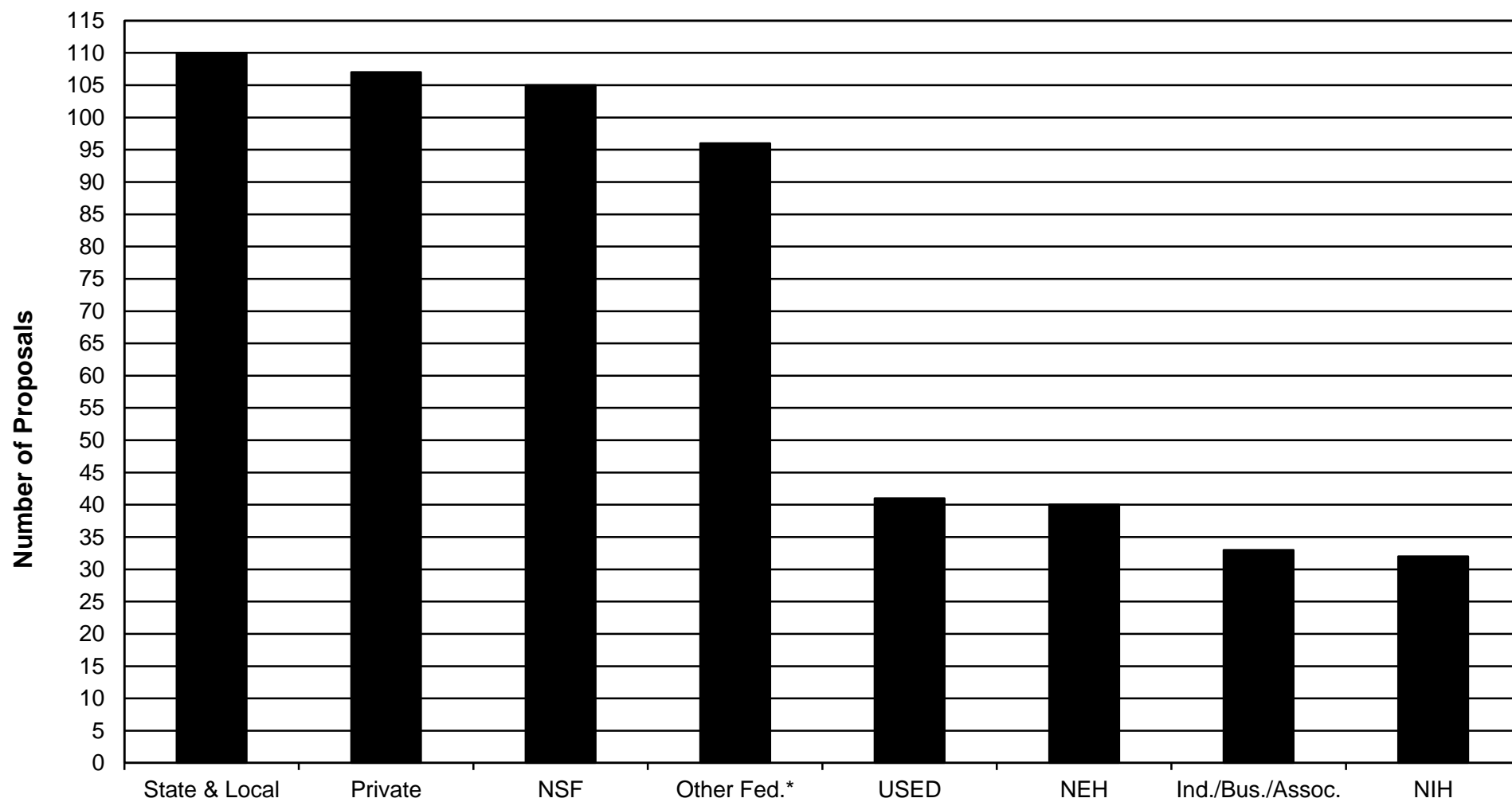
# EXTERNAL GRANT PROPOSALS BY DEPARTMENT 2001-13

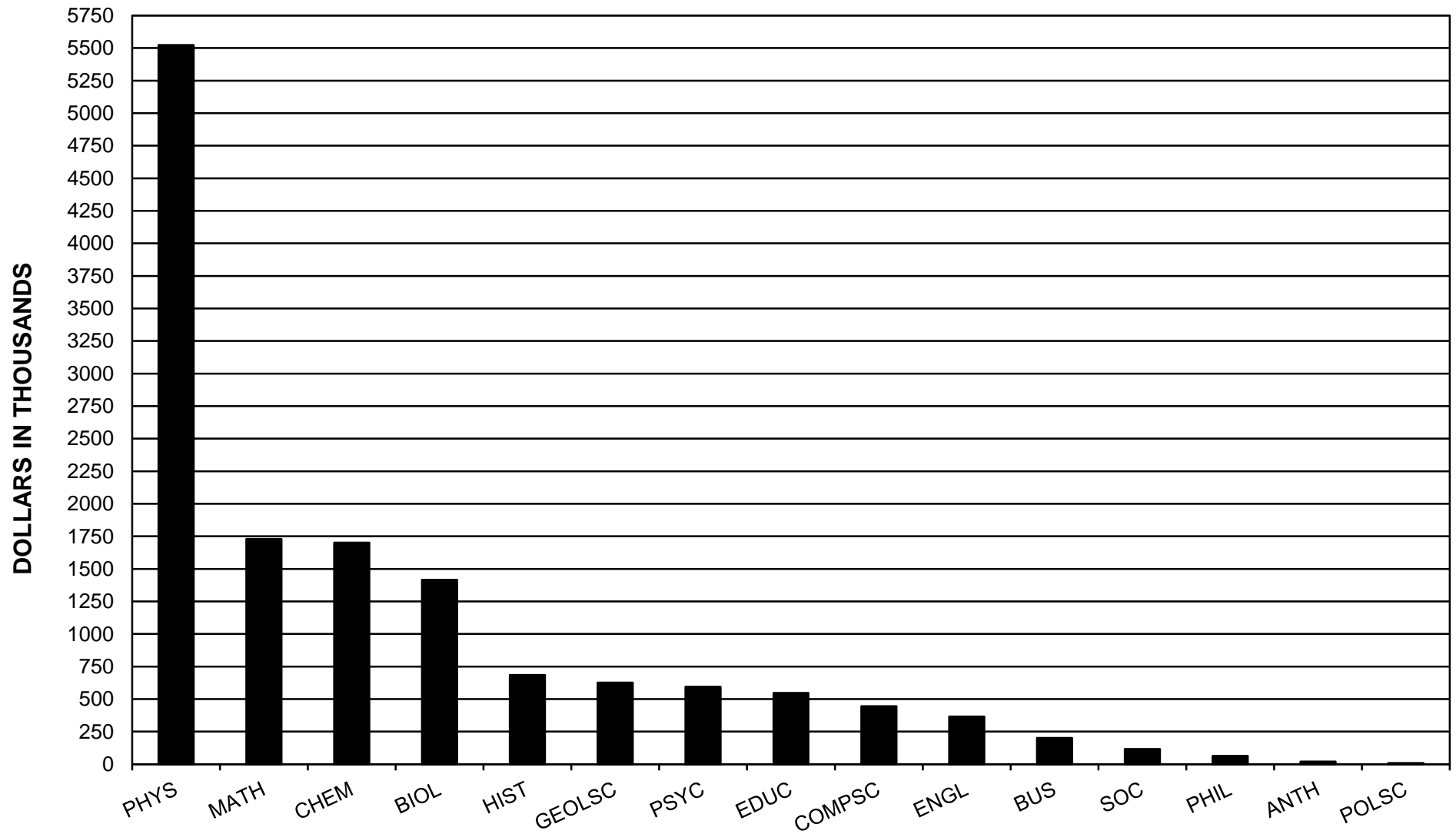

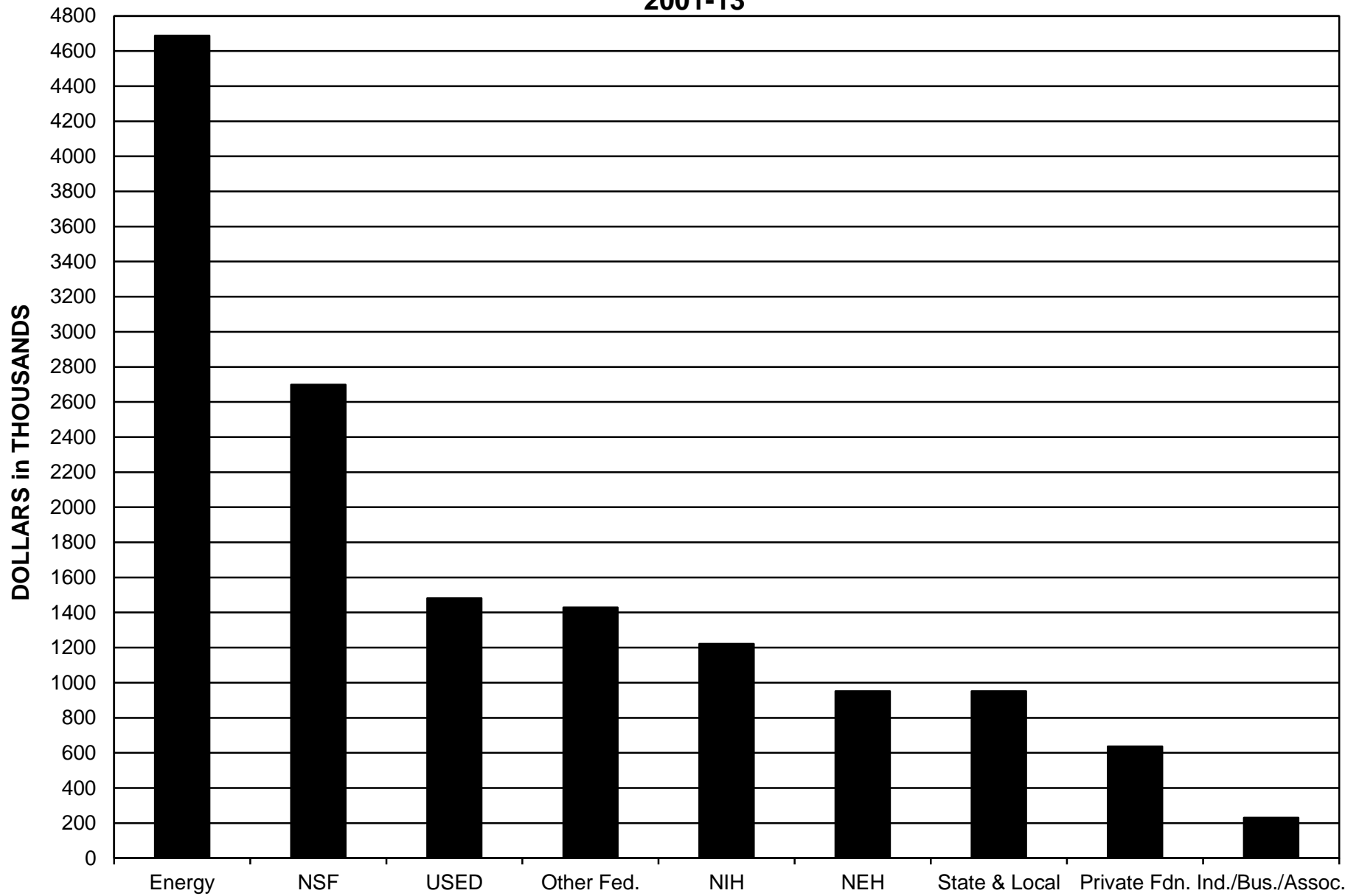
## EXTERNAL GRANT EXPENDITURES BY DEPARTMENT 2001-13\*

## RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT AND SUPPORT PROGRAMS 2012-13

The Research Council offers a wide range of programs to support research development and scholarly and creative activity.

### Programs for Faculty Members

- **Presidential Summer Fellowships** provide untenured faculty with an opportunity to participate in scholarly activities and establish an ongoing research program. Up to six \$3,500 stipends are awarded annually from funds provided by the College.
- **Geneseo Foundation Summer Fellowships and the Roemer Summer Fellowship** support the research and creative projects of faculty who have been awarded tenure. These fellowships are intended to enable completion of a significant project or to embark in a new direction. The \$4,000 Geneseo Foundation Summer Fellowships are funded by the Geneseo Foundation, and the \$5,000 Roemer award is supported by an endowment gift to the Geneseo Foundation from the late Dr. Spencer Roemer.
- **CIEE International Faculty Development Seminar Award** supports the participation of one member of our faculty in a summer seminar of their choosing as offered annually by the Council on International Educational Exchange. The award provides \$5,000 towards the seminar fee and other related expenses. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Proposal Writing Support Awards** provide full-time faculty members with time and other forms of support to write major proposals for submission to external funding agencies. Faculty members may request support for the writing of either: 1) new proposals, or 2) significant revisions of previously submitted proposals. Support will be considered for major proposals in all academic fields and for a variety of initiatives (e.g. fellowships, research grants, or educational grants). The maximum award is \$3,750 or one course release. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Research Development Awards** provide support for a wide variety of needs associated with developing research and scholarly projects. Maximum award is \$1,000 or one-course release time. Funding is provided by the College.
- **Indirect Cost Return Awards** return part of the indirect costs to the project director for research expenses not covered by budgeted costs. Funded by the College.
- **Incentive Grants** are intended to encourage and support faculty initiatives in research and to fund pilot studies, completion of manuscripts, data analyses, bibliographic or archival searches, and creative work. Travel to archives, libraries, and laboratories is also supported. Awards are limited to \$1,000, but faculty may request an additional \$500 to support the cost of involving a student in the proposed project. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Faculty Travel Grants** are made to participants in professional meetings. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation. Maximum annual awards are \$800 for travel within the



U.S. (excluding Hawaii) and Canada, and \$1,000 for travel to Hawaii or outside the U.S. and Canada.

- **Page Charge** allocations cover the costs of faculty publications in journals with mandatory page charges. Funded by the College.
- The **Hurrell/McNaron Award for Scholarly Presentation** provides a \$1,000 award to an untenured faculty member in support of an outstanding paper delivered at a major conference in the discipline. The award is funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an anonymous donor.

### Programs for Students

- **Undergraduate Research and Travel Grants** support student research and conference participation in conjunction with a faculty member. Maximum awards are \$600 per student per semester. Funded by the Student Association and the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Graduate Student Research and Travel Grants** support graduate student research and conference participation in conjunction with a faculty member. Maximum awards are \$600 per student per semester. Funded by the College.
- **The Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes Research Award** supports undergraduate student research or field study. Preference is given to scholarly research combining a natural science and a social science such as biology/sociology or geology/anthropology. The maximum award was \$600 for the 2012-13 year. Funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an endowment established by Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes.
- **Dean Johnston and Geneseo Foundation Student Research Assistantships** provide faculty members with paid research assistants for their scholarly projects. Undergraduate students receive a stipend of \$1,000. The Dean Johnston Assistantships are funded through an endowment established by CPAC, Inc.
- **Undergraduate Summer Fellowships** provide a \$3,000 stipend for students to undertake a research or creative project under the direction of a faculty member. Students must devote two consecutive summer months to their project. Funded by Follett Higher Education Group and the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Research Foundation for SUNY/SUNY Geneseo STEM Undergraduate Summer Research Fellowships** support research experiences for undergraduate students in the science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) fields under the direction of a faculty member. Awards of \$3,500 each will provide each fellow a stipend and up to \$500 for research supplies. Funded by the Research Foundation for SUNY and the Geneseo Foundation.

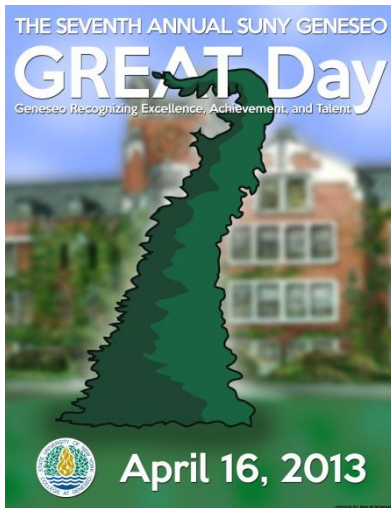

## Seventh Annual Geneseo Recognizing Excellence, Achievement and Talent (GREAT) Day

**Tuesday, April 16, 2013**

Geneseo Recognizing Excellence, Achievement & Talent Day is a college-wide symposium celebrating the creative and scholarly endeavors of our students. In addition to recognizing the achievements of our students, the purpose of GREAT Day is to help foster academic excellence, encourage professional development, and build connections within the community. This year 965 students submitted presentations for GREAT Day/

### **The Jack '76 and Carol '76 Kramer Endowed Lectureship**

#### **Dava Sobel, Author, “Bringing Copernicus to Life in Prose and Script”**

Dava Sobel, a former New York Times science reporter, is the author of *Longitude*, *Galileo's Daughter*, *The Planets*, and *A More Perfect Heaven*. In her forty years as a science journalist she has written for many magazines, including *Audubon*, *Discover*, *Life*, and *The New Yorker*, served as a contributing editor to *Harvard Magazine* and *Omni*, and co-authored five books, including *Is Anyone Out There?* with astronomer Frank Drake. Ms. Sobel received the 2001 Individual Public Service Award from the National Science Board "for fostering awareness of science and technology among broad segments of the general public." Also in 2001, the Boston Museum of Science gave her its prestigious Bradford Washburn Award for her "outstanding contribution toward public understanding of science, appreciation of its fascination, and the vital role it plays in all our lives." In October 2004, in London, Ms. Sobel received the Harrison Medal from the Worshipful Company of Clockmakers, in recognition of her contribution to increasing awareness of the science of horology by the general public, through her writing and lecturing. In 2008 the Astronomical Society of the Pacific gave her its Klumpke-Roberts Award for "increasing the public understanding and appreciation of astronomy."

Her GREAT Day keynote was entitled "Bringing Copernicus to Life in Prose and Script." In 2006 her stage play about sixteenth-century astronomer Nicolaus Copernicus, called *And the Sun Stood Still* was commissioned by the Manhattan Theatre Club through the Alfred P. Sloan Initiative, and was also supported by a Fellowship from the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation. Sobel stated that "My play about Copernicus, *And the Sun Stood Still*, portrays the events that made him buck common sense and received wisdom to defend the Earth's motion around the Sun. The theme of the piece is a familiar favorite of mine: the great transformation of humankind's worldview through science." During her presentation, Gary Towsley (Mathematics) portrayed Copernicus.
