

Comments on the 2019-20 Annual Report of the Office of Sponsored Research

Traditional Funding Activities: In 2019-20 we reached \$1,840,723 for total awards, which was the result of 16 awards to 27 faculty and staff Pls and co-Pls in 8 departments. This is the 5th highest amount of annual awards in the last 20 years. During the 2019-20 year 53 faculty and staff members submitted 40 proposals totaling \$6,377,572 in requests. Total grant expenditures for our 47 active projects reached \$1,720,677; \$314,639 through State accounts and \$1,406,038 through the Research Foundation for SUNY.

In the State of New York-funded programs, Milne Library received continuing support from the New York State Education Department. In SUNY-funded programs, faculty and staff from the Office of the Dean of Academic Planning and Advising, Biology, the Center for Integrative Learning, the Office of Diversity and Equity, and the Provost's Office continued work on SUNY Expanded Investment and Performance Fund (PIF) awards. The Center for Digital Learning had an active SUNY Innovative Instruction Technology Grants (IITG) tier 3 award and Health and Counseling held ongoing campus grant support from NY State OASAS.

Our Ronald E. McNair Postbaccalaureate Achievement Program award to the Access Opportunity Programs continued this year and we submitted a TRIO Student Support Services (SSS) proposal as well. The Office of Diversity and Equity's U.S. Department of Justice's Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) award continued this year and a renewal proposal was also submitted and is under review.

In addition to PIF funding, the Biology Department had ongoing research support from the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases and the Livingston County Planning Department. Faculty in the Department of Chemistry received two new NSF awards. The first, which has a co-PI in the department of Political Science and International Relations, is an ADVANCE: Organizational Change for Gender Equity in STEM Academic Professions award, and the second is an Improving Undergraduate Science Education (IUSE) award. Chemistry also had ongoing support from a Jean Dreyfus Lectureship for Undergraduate Students, which supported both a lectureship and undergraduate research stipends.

The School of Education was again very active in 2019-20. Awards from the United Way, the Rochester Area Community Foundation's (RACF) Feinbloom Supporting Foundation, and the Greater Rochester Summer Learning Association supported the Soaring Stars program. The 2019 Rochester Young Scholars Academy at Geneseo had support from the Greater Rochester Summer Learning Association, Rochester City School District (RCSD), and the United Way of Greater Rochester. Education faculty also received two NEA Foundation awards this year and a continuing award from RCSD supports our partnership with the Dr. Charles T. Lunford School 19 on its School Improvement Grant.

Faculty members in the Geography Department had continuing NSF research support, and faculty from the English Department had continuing support from the Modern Language Association for curriculum development. The Department of Geological Sciences had continuing support from NASA directly and a NASA subaward through SUNY Stony Brook; it also had ongoing NSF support for the GEOS S-STEM scholarship program. Faculty in the History Department received an award from the National Heritage Trust in collaboration with the NY State Parks Division of Historic Preservation. A faculty member in Mathematics held ongoing NSF research funding and the Music Department had ongoing Council on Library and Information Resources support.

The Department of Physics and Astronomy had continuing support for its NSF Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship Program and its NSF Research Experiences for Undergraduates (REU) site, "Supporting Undergraduate Research at Geneseo (SURGE)." Faculty members also secured new awards from the NSF through the American Physical Society, the U.S. Department of Energy through the Laboratory for Laser Energetics at the University of Rochester, and NASA through Cornell University's Space Grant. Finally, a new NSF grant supports astronomy research in collaboration with the University of Indiana.

In addition to the NSF ADVANCE award noted above, the Political Science and International Relations Department also received a Jack Miller Center award for a program on Constitutionalism and Democracy.

The Psychology Department continued research supported by two Academic Research Enhancement (AREA) awards from the National Institute on Drug Abuse and the National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke and a National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism (NIAAA) subaward from the University at Buffalo.

Finally, the Center for Integrative Learning received a Campus Compact of NY and PA award for supporting the creativity and skills sharing of refugees, immigrants, and forced migrants.

During 2019-20 we continued our relationship with McAllister & Quinn (M&Q), whose staff members worked with us on proposals submitted to: the NSF IUSE program; the U.S. Department of Education's Student Support Services program; the NSF Scholarships in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics Program (S-STEM) program; a renewal submission for our DOJ Office on Violence Against Women Campus Grant; the Howard Hughes Medical Institute's Inclusive Excellence 3 preproposal; an NIH Academic Research Enhancement Award; and an NSF Major Research Instrumentation Award.

Internal Funding: In collaboration with the Geneseo Foundation, the Research Foundation for SUNY, and the Offices of Accounting and Grants Management, the Research Council reviewed applications from faculty members and students that resulted in 341 individual awards with a total value of \$317,610. Total internal funding for our formal grant and fellowship programs, combined with other planned expenditures in support of research and scholarly activities, amounted to \$362,419—a record.

GREAT Day: Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Geneseo's 14th annual GREAT Day was rapidly migrated to a virtual event by GREAT Day Coordinator Patty Hamilton-Rodgers in collaboration with Jonathan Grunert from the Milne Library, Joe Dolce from CIT, and Adam Klinges from CIT. The virtual GREAT Day was an excellent success with 2,824 unique users and 13,244 page views. Details on participation can be found under the GREAT Day Highlights (page 25).







RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT AND SUPPORT PROGRAMS 2019-20

The Research Council offers a wide range of programs to support research development and scholarly and creative activity.

Programs for Faculty Members

- **Presidential Summer Fellowships** provide untenured faculty with an opportunity to participate in scholarly activities and establish an ongoing research program. Up to six \$3,500 stipends are awarded annually from funds provided by the College.
- Geneseo Foundation Summer Fellowships and the Roemer Summer Fellowship support the research and creative projects of faculty who have been awarded tenure. These fellowships are intended to enable completion of a significant project or to embark in a new direction. The \$4,000 Geneseo Foundation Summer Fellowships are funded by the Geneseo Foundation, and the \$5,000 Roemer award is supported by an endowment gift to the Geneseo Foundation from the late Dr. Spencer Roemer.
- Proposal Writing Support Awards provide full-time faculty members with time and other forms of support to write proposals requesting at least \$15,000 in funding for submission to external funding agencies. Faculty members may request support for the writing of either:

 new proposals, or 2) significant revisions of previously submitted proposals. Support will be considered for major proposals in all academic fields and for a variety of initiatives (e.g. fellowships, research grants, or educational grants). The maximum individual award is \$3,750, one course reassignment, or \$2,500 for summer salary. Collaborative submissions are also supported. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Research Development Awards provide support for a wide variety of needs associated
 with developing research and scholarly projects. Maximum award is \$1,000 or one course
 reassignment. Funded by the College.
- Indirect Cost Return Awards return part of the indirect costs to the project director for research expenses not covered by budgeted costs. Funded by the College.
- **Incentive Grants** are intended to encourage and support faculty initiatives in research and to fund pilot studies, completion of manuscripts, data analyses, bibliographic or archival searches, and creative work. Travel to archives, libraries, and laboratories is also supported. Awards are limited to \$1,000, but faculty may request an additional \$500 to support the cost of involving a student in the proposed project. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Faculty Travel Grants are made to participants in professional meetings. Maximum annual awards are \$800 for travel within the U.S. (excluding Hawaii) and Canada, and \$1,000 for travel to Hawaii or outside the U.S. and Canada. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Page Charge allocations cover the costs of faculty publications in journals with mandatory page charges. Funded by the College.
- The Hurrell/McNaron Award for Scholarly Presentation provides a \$1,000 award to an
 untenured faculty member in support of an outstanding paper delivered at a major
 conference in the discipline. Funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an anonymous
 donor.

Programs for Students

- Undergraduate Travel, Research, and Creativity (TRAC) Grants support student research and conference participation in conjunction with a faculty member. Maximum awards are \$600 per student per semester or \$1,800 per group per semester. Funded by the Student Association and the Geneseo Foundation.
- Graduate Student Research and Travel Grants support graduate student research and conference participation in conjunction with a faculty member. Maximum awards are \$600 per student per semester. Funded by the College.
- The Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes Research Award supports undergraduate student research or field study. Preference is given to scholarly research combining a natural science and a social science such as biology/sociology or geology/ anthropology. The awardee is chosen from among successful Geneseo Foundation Undergraduate Summer Research Fellowship and Geneseo Foundation Research Assistantship applicants. The maximum award is \$600. Funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an endowment established by Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes.
- Dean Johnston and Geneseo Foundation Student Research Assistantships provide faculty members with research assistants for their scholarly projects. Undergraduate students receive a stipend of \$1,000. Funded through an endowment established by CPAC, Inc.
- Undergraduate Summer Fellowships provide a \$3,000 (full-time) or \$1,000 (part-time) stipend for students to undertake a research or creative project under the direction of a faculty member. Students must devote to their project either two consecutive summer months of effort for full-time awards or approximately 3 weeks (which may be spread across the summer) for part-time awards. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- Jason and Diana Kyrwood '95 Student/Faculty Research Endowed Fellowship in
 Honor of Ellen Kintz provides \$2,500 plus an additional \$500 (\$3,000 total) for a stipend
 for an undergraduate student to work with a faculty member in the social sciences on an
 existing research project. Recipients must devote two consecutive summer months to the
 project. Funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an endowment established by Jason
 and Diana Kyrwood in honor of emerita faculty member Ellen Kintz.
- Sorrell Chesin '58 Research Award provides financial support to recognize students who
 have successfully undertaken a research experience in the physical and natural sciences
 and related disciplines under the direction or mentorship of a faculty member in the field of
 study and to promote this research experience. Funded by an endowment established by
 Sorrell Chesin '58.






