Report on the Livingston County CARES For Our Healthcare Workers Project Prepared by: Tom Matthews, President, Livingston County Cares, Inc.

Livingston CARES followed up our *Front Line Workers Appreciation Project* that took place in 2020 with the *Livingston County CARES for Our Healthcare Workers* initiative in March 2021.

On Thursday, March 25, seventeen volunteers including board members, students, staff, and community members delivered over 2600 gourmet cookies to 118 healthcare worksites throughout Livingston County.

The 2021 Livingston County CARES for Our Healthcare Workers Initiative: The Board of Directors approved a second project to focus specifically on recognizing our healthcare workers who have been dealing with the pandemic for over 12 months. The existing

Livingston CARES COVID-19 Committee: The CARES COVID-19 Committee members organized and managed the details of the second project to express appreciation to workers engaged in addressing the pandemic. Committee members included Karen Bailey, Adam Clarke, Brenda Donohue, Angela Ellis, Garth Freeman, Karissa Garbarini, Holly Harvey, Ken Kallio, Haley Kent, Tom Matthews, and Jules Orcutt.

The 2021 Project Story: In January and February, committee members compiled information on over 100 healthcare public and private agencies and businesses in the county, called each agency to verify numbers of employees and hours of operation, and organized a plan to distribute a gourmet cookie with a thank you message to each healthcare worker. In the early stages of planning, the estimated number of workers was 800, but expanded to a final list of over 2,600 people. The committee asked two facilities with large commercial kitchens to contribute to the project by baking cookies if Livingston CARES provided the cookie dough. Both Morrison Living at the Livingston County Center for Nursing & Rehabilitation (LCCNR) and SUNY Geneseo Campus Auxiliary Services (CAS) enthusiastically agreed by each baking, wrapping and packaging approximately 1,300 cookies in 60 gift bags and boxes for volunteer drivers



to deliver to 118 work locations throughout the county. C & R Foods in Mt. Morris ordered 34 boxes of cookie dough and delivered them to the two baking locations. Brian & Rachel Heywood from C & R Foods and Craig & Sharon Bolesky each donated several boxes of cookie dough and Livingston CARES purchased the remaining boxes that were delivered to the kitchens on March 12. The cookies were baked on March 22-24.

The cookies and packages from both kitchens were delivered to the MacVittie College

Union Circle Drive on Thursday, March 25. Seventeen (17) driver volunteers picked up their assigned bags and delivered them to 118 locations throughout the county. Each location received a card thanking the donors and contributors and a message of thanks with a handwritten thank you from the APO service fraternity at SUNY Geneseo.

The healthcare locations included the UR/Noyes Hospital in Dansville and the UR/Noyes Urgent Care facility in Geneseo, pharmacies, chiropractors, physical therapy offices, mental health clinics, family medical offices, nursing homes, dental and orthodontics care offices, eye care specialists, hearing specialists, medical specialty offices, OBGYN clinics, breast clinics, podiatrists, medical labs, the 17 Emergency Medical Services



locations throughout the county, the Office for the Aging, the Department of Health, and the SUNY Geneseo Lauderdale Health Center.

Ken Kallio and Haley Kent of Livingston CARES dropped off over 500 cookies at Noyes Health this morning to thank healthcare workers for their dedication.
