

Comments on the Annual Report of the Office of Sponsored Research

Traditional Funding Activities: In 2014-15 we reached a record high of \$3,629,626 for total awards. This exceeds our prior highest year's total (\$2,352,675 in 2004-05) by over \$1.2 million. The 2014-15 record total was the result of 26 awards to 18 faculty and staff members in 13 departments and offices, and included two large awards for scholarship programs from the National Science Foundation (NSF). During the 2014-15 year 34 faculty and staff members submitted 50 proposals totaling over \$10,900,000 in requests. Total grant expenditures for our 39 active projects was \$1,481,415; \$1,395,165 through the Research Foundation for SUNY and \$86,250 through State accounts.

In SUNY-funded programs, faculty and staff from Milne Library, Geological Sciences, and Mathematics had active SUNY Innovative Instruction Technology Grant (IITG) awards, and two new IITG awards were made to the Geography and Music Departments for the coming year. The History Department received a SUNY Arts and Humanities Network of Excellence Award for the coming year as well. Milne Library also received a SUNY Conversations in the Disciplines award this year and the Physics and Astronomy Department had a continuing SUNY 4E Network of Excellence award.

The Biology Department had continuing support from the Livingston County Planning Department and the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Disease; and the Chemistry Department's U.S. Department of Energy award provided continuing support for the Molecular Structure Lab. A National Endowment for the Humanities award through the University of Vermont to the English Department supported a Summer Seminar in Italy on Dante's *Commedia*.

The School of Education was very active in 2014-15. Awards from the Rochester City School District and the Farash Foundation supported the 2014 Rochester Young Scholars Academy at Geneseo, which again received support from these sources for the 2015 program, "Food Fusion Showdown." Three active awards through SUNY supported the Teacher and Leader Education Network, and a continuing award supported Geneseo's involvement in the James Monroe High School's School Improvement Grant. Awards from the Wilson Foundation, the Feinbloom Supporting Foundation, and the United Way supported the 2014 Soaring Stars program, and new awards from the Wilson and Feinbloom Foundations and the Greater Rochester Learning Association were received for the 2015 program. An award from the NY State Education Department for the NY math and ELA core curriculum supported work by a consortium of institutions on scaffolds for students with disabilities. Finally, one faculty member received a Fulbright for research and teaching in Iceland for the fall semester of 2015.

The Geological Sciences Department received a large NSF grant through the Scholarships in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics Program (S-STEM). This award will provide scholarships and academic and career support initiatives for academically talented students in the geology, geochemistry, and geophysics degree programs. Research in the Geological Sciences Department was supported by four on-going NSF grants, a new NSF Major Research Instrumentation award for an inductively coupled plasma optical-emission spectrometer, and a new award from NASA for planetary geology.

A faculty member in the History Department was supported via a National Humanities Center fellowship for the year and will commence a National Endowment for the Humanities fellowship this fall. One Mathematics faculty member had support from the Center for Undergraduate Research in Mathematics (through Brigham Young University) and the Educational Advancement Foundation; and another received an American Mathematical Society Congressional Fellowship for 2015-16.

The Physics and Astronomy Department received a \$1.2 million NSF grant through the Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship Program. This award, which is the largest single grant award ever received by the College, will provide scholarships, a teaching field school, and internship experiences to pre-service physics teacher candidates. Faculty members in the Department of Physics and Astronomy continued research and educational programs with on-going funding from the Physics Teacher Education Coalition, the U.S. Department of Energy (through the Laboratory for Laser Energetics, University of Rochester), and NASA (through Cornell University). An award from the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) supported a Physics undergraduate for a Summer Undergraduate Research

Fellowship (SURF) at NIST, and a new award from Central Washington University will support a student for a Council on Undergraduate Research/NSF Research Experience for Undergraduates (REU) award at Geneseo for the summer of 2015.

A faculty member in the Department of Political Science and International Relations has received an NSF collaborative research award in conjunction with American University. The Psychology Department had ongoing support from an AAC&U Bringing Theory to Practice award, and one faculty member has received two subawards from the University of Notre Dame. The Athletics Department had a continuing NCAA Division III Ethnic Minority and Women's Internship grant award, and a NY Prize NYSERDA proposal developed by the Office of Sustainability and the Office for the Vice President for Administration and Finance resulted in a new award for a feasibility study for the possible establishment of a microgrid to support both the Village of Geneseo and the College.

During 2014-15 we continued our relationship with McAllister and Quinn, whose staff members worked with us on both the NSF S-STEM and Noyce Teacher Scholars proposals. During the year they also assisted with proposals to the National Endowment for the Humanities Challenge Grant program, the NSF MRI program, and various sources for support of Geneseo's Soaring Stars summer program.

Internal Funding: In collaboration with the Geneseo Foundation, the Research Foundation for SUNY, and the Offices of Accounting and Grants Management, the Research Council reviewed applications from faculty members and students that resulted in an all-time record of 456 individual awards with a total value of \$328,046. Total internal funding for our formal grant and fellowship programs, combined with other planned expenditures in support of research and scholarly activities, amounted to more than \$343,000.

GREAT Day: Geneseo's ninth annual GREAT Day was a tremendous success with 915 students participating in 491 presentations, performances, and exhibits. Dr. James T. Campbell, Organization of American Historians Distinguished Lecturer and Edgar E. Robinson Professor of University States History at Stanford University, presented the seventh annual keynote address supported by the Jack '76 and Carol '76 Kramer Endowed Lectureship. His address focused on the history of the Mississippi Civil Right Movement and its illumination of the ongoing struggle over how Americans remember and recount their racial past.

Addition to our Annual Report: We are now including a list of student fellowship and assistantship awards and data on the Undergraduate Research and Travel Grants program—our largest single campus-based program, which is supported by the Student Association and the Geneseo Foundation.

EXTERNAL GRANT EXPENDITURES PROFILED BY TYPE OF ACTIVITY 1999-2015









RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT AND SUPPORT PROGRAMS 2014-15

The Research Council offers a wide range of programs to support research development and scholarly and creative activity.

Programs for Faculty Members

- **Presidential Summer Fellowships** provide untenured faculty with an opportunity to participate in scholarly activities and establish an ongoing research program. Up to six \$3,500 stipends are awarded annually from funds provided by the College.
- **Geneseo Foundation Summer Fellowships and the Roemer Summer Fellowship** support the research and creative projects of faculty who have been awarded tenure. These fellowships are intended to enable completion of a significant project or to embark in a new direction. The \$4,000 Geneseo Foundation Summer Fellowships are funded by the Geneseo Foundation, and the \$5,000 Roemer award is supported by an endowment gift to the Geneseo Foundation from the late Dr. Spencer Roemer.
- **CIEE International Faculty Development Seminar Award** supports the participation of one member of our faculty in a summer seminar of their choosing as offered annually by the Council on International Educational Exchange. The award provides \$5,000 towards the seminar fee and other related expenses. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Proposal Writing Support Awards** provide full-time faculty members with time and other forms of support to write major proposals for submission to external funding agencies. Faculty members may request support for the writing of either: 1) new proposals, or 2) significant revisions of previously submitted proposals. Support will be considered for major proposals in all academic fields and for a variety of initiatives (e.g. fellowships, research grants, or educational grants). The maximum award is \$3,750, one course release, or \$2,500 for summer salary. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Research Development Awards** provide support for a wide variety of needs associated with developing research and scholarly projects. Maximum award is \$1,000 or one course release. Funded by the College.
- **Indirect Cost Return Awards** return part of the indirect costs to the project director for research expenses not covered by budgeted costs. Funded by the College.
- **Incentive Grants** are intended to encourage and support faculty initiatives in research and to fund pilot studies, completion of manuscripts, data analyses, bibliographic or archival searches, and creative work. Travel to archives, libraries, and laboratories is also supported. Awards are limited to \$1,000, but faculty may request an additional \$500 to support the cost of involving a student in the proposed project. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Faculty Travel Grants** are made to participants in professional meetings. Maximum annual awards are \$800 for travel within the U.S. (excluding Hawaii) and Canada, and \$1,000 for travel to Hawaii or outside the U.S. and Canada. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.

- **Page Charge** allocations cover the costs of faculty publications in journals with mandatory page charges. Funded by the College.
- The **Hurrell/McNaron Award for Scholarly Presentation** provides a \$1,000 award to an untenured faculty member in support of an outstanding paper delivered at a major conference in the discipline. Funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an anonymous donor.

Programs for Students

- **Undergraduate Research and Travel Grants** support student research and conference participation in conjunction with a faculty member. Maximum awards are \$600 per student per semester or \$1,500 per group per semester. Funded by the Student Association and the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Graduate Student Research and Travel Grants** support graduate student research and conference participation in conjunction with a faculty member. Maximum awards are \$600 per student per semester. Funded by the College.
- **The Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes Research Award** supports undergraduate student research or field study. Preference is given to scholarly research combining a natural science and a social science such as biology/sociology or geology/anthropology. The awardee is chosen from among successful Geneseo Foundation Undergraduate Summer Research Fellowship and Geneseo Foundation Research Assistantship applicants. The maximum award is \$600. Funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an endowment established by Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes.
- **Dean Johnston and Geneseo Foundation Student Research Assistantships** provide faculty members with paid research assistants for their scholarly projects. Undergraduate students receive a stipend of \$1,000. Funded through an endowment established by CPAC, Inc.
- **Undergraduate Summer Fellowships** provide a \$3,000 stipend for students to undertake a research or creative project under the direction of a faculty member. Students must devote two consecutive summer months to their project. Funded by Follett Higher Education Group and the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Jason and Diana Kyrwood '95 Student/Faculty Research Endowed Fellowship in Honor of Ellen Kintz** provides a \$2,500 stipend for an undergraduate student to work with a faculty member in the social sciences on an existing research project. Recipients must devote two consecutive summer months to the project. Funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an endowment established by Jason and Diana Kyrwood in honor of emerita faculty member Ellen Kintz.





**JAMES T. CAMPBELL, Organization of American Historians
Distinguished Lecturer**
**"Freedom Now: The Mississippi Freedom Movement In History
And Memory"**




James T. Campbell describes himself as "an historian of the Black Atlantic." His research explores American, African American, and African history and the dense web of connections between them. His GREAT Day keynote, entitled "Freedom Now: The Mississippi Freedom Movement in History and Memory," will use the history of the Mississippi Civil Rights Movement (and of the 1964 Mississippi Summer Project in particular) to illuminate the ongoing struggle over how Americans remember and recount their racial past. The talk will examine not only historical textbooks and monographs, but also a wide array of alternative sites where historical memory is produced and disseminated, including museums and monuments, historic sites and Hollywood movies, memorial services and criminal trials.

Dr. Campbell is the Edgar E. Robinson Professor in United States History at Stanford University. He previously taught at Northwestern University, Wits University (in Johannesburg, South Africa), and Brown University, where he chaired the University Steering Committee on Slavery and Justice, a committee tasked by then President Ruth Simmons to examine and disclose the facts of Brown's historic relationship to slavery and the transatlantic slave trade. He credits this experience with awakening his interest in the politics of historical memory. Dr. Campbell also serves as one of the consulting historians for the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of African American History and Culture, opening in Washington DC in 2016.

Dr. Campbell has published numerous books and articles, including *Songs of Zion: The African Methodist Episcopal Church in the United States and South Africa; Race, Nation, and Empire in American History*; and *Middle Passages: African American Journeys to Africa, 1787-2005*, which was a finalist for the 2007 Pulitzer Prize in History. He is currently working on a study of the Mississippi Freedom Movement in history and memory, the topic of his keynote address.
