Comments on the Annual Report of the Office of Sponsored Research

Traditional Funding Activities: The number of external proposal submissions hit its highest point since 2007-08. Thirty-four faculty and staff members from fourteen different departments generated a total of 45 submissions. The total value of awards received during the year was over \$1,195,000. Total grant expenditures through the Research Foundation of SUNY for our 29 active projects reached an all-time high of more than \$1,640,000. Faculty members in the Department of Physics and Astronomy received a new award from the Physics Teacher Education Coalition and continued research with on-going funding from the U.S. Department of Energy (through the Laboratory for Laser Energetics, University of Rochester), NASA (through Cornell University), and the National Science Foundation (NSF). The Chemistry Department, in addition to its on-going support from the Research Corporation for Science Advancement, used funds from its two Congressional grants to complete the Molecular Structure Lab, which had its grand opening on April 18, 2012. A new NSF grant was awarded to Geological Sciences faculty, adding to existing research support from three other NSF grants. Biology faculty received a new three-year NIH grant, bringing our total NIH funding (either directly or through subawards) to four awards in Biology and Psychology. Research in Biology was also supported by a new award from the Livingston County Planning Department through SUNY Brockport. The National Endowment for the Humanities continued to support a program in the English Department, and Sociology Department research was supported by a Fulbright-Hays Faculty Research Abroad award from the U.S. Department of Education. The School of Education made great strides in funding for summer programs this year. Working with the Greater Rochester Summer Learning Association, and thanks to new funds from the Max and Marian Farash Charitable Foundation and continued funding from the Rochester City School District, the Rochester Young Scholars Academy summer camp program was able to expand this year's Crime Scene Investigation (CSI) to include recent refugees. In addition, a three-year commitment from the Marie C. and Joseph C. Wilson Foundation provided support for the establishment of the "Soaring Stars" summer program for rural K-6 students.

Internal Funding: In collaboration with the Research Council, the Geneseo Foundation, and the Offices of Accounting and Grants Management, over 360 internal funding applications from faculty members and students were received and processed, resulting in 352 individual awards totaling \$284,648—the highest amount in Geneseo's history. Total internal funding for our formal grant and fellowship programs, combined with other planned expenditures in support of research and scholarly activities, amounted to more than \$307,000. Supported by funds from Geneseo Foundation for the 2011-12 year, the Research Council established and awarded the first CIEE International Faculty Development Summer Seminar Award of \$5,000.

GREAT Day: Geneseo's sixth annual GREAT Day was a huge success, with 902 students participating in 512 presentations, performances, and exhibits. Dr. Fredrik Hiebert, National Geographic Archaeology Fellow, presented the fourth annual keynote address supported by the Jack '76 and Carol '76 Kramer Endowed Lectureship. The address, "Afghanistan: Cultural Crossroads – Then and Now," was a fascinating and informative account of his work with curators at the Kabul National Museum in Afghanistan, where he led the team that conducted an inventory of the newly-discovered treasures of the museum—art objects and archaeological finds which had been hidden for their protection during a tumultuous decade of civil war.

Other Initiatives: A gift of 25 refurbished lap top computers from Dell supported the Distributed Systems Lab in Computer Science. A gift from the Corning Foundation will support 10 faculty awards over the next two years for integration of service-leaning into courses. The very successful Real World Geneseo (RWG) program was funded for a fourth year by the SUNY Office of Diversity and Educational Equity, allowing for a new collaboration with Monroe Community College. Finally, we were most pleased to learn that Dr. Amr Elsherif, Assistant Professor of English Language and Literature at Damansour University in Egypt, will join SUNY Geneseo as a Fulbright Visiting Scholar for the 2012-13 year, teaching in both the English and Languages and Literatures Departments.





RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT AND SUPPORT PROGRAMS 2011-12

The Research Council offers a wide range of programs to support research development and scholarly and creative activity.

Programs for Faculty Members

- **Presidential Summer Fellowships** provide untenured faculty with an opportunity to participate in scholarly activities and establish an ongoing research program. Up to six \$3,500 stipends are awarded annually from funds provided by the College.
- **Geneseo Foundation Summer Fellowships and the Roemer Summer Fellowship** support the research and creative projects of faculty who have been awarded tenure. These fellowships are intended to enable completion of a significant project or to embark in a new direction. The \$4,000 Geneseo Foundation Summer Fellowships are funded by the Geneseo Foundation, and the \$5,000 Roemer award is supported by an endowment gift to the Geneseo Foundation from the late Dr. Spencer Roemer.
- **CIEE International Faculty Development Seminar Award** supports the participation of one member of our faculty in a summer seminar of their choosing as offered annually by the Council on International Educational Exchange. The award provides \$5,000 towards the seminar fee and other related expenses. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Proposal Writing Support Awards** provide full-time faculty members with time and other forms of support to write major proposals for submission to external funding agencies. Faculty members may request support for the writing of either: 1) new proposals, or 2) significant revisions of previously submitted proposals. Support will be considered for major proposals in all academic fields and for a variety of initiatives (e.g. fellowships, research grants, or educational grants). The maximum award is \$3,750 or one course release. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Research Development Awards** provide support for a wide variety of needs associated with developing research and scholarly projects. Maximum award is \$1,000 or one-course release time. Funding is provided by the College.
- **Indirect Cost Return Awards** return part of the indirect costs to the project director for research expenses not covered by budgeted costs. Funded by the College.
- **Incentive Grants** are intended to encourage and support faculty initiatives in research and to fund pilot studies, completion of manuscripts, data analyses, bibliographic or archival searches, and creative work. Travel to archives, libraries, and laboratories is also supported. Awards are limited to \$1,000, but faculty may request an additional \$500 to support the cost of involving a student in the proposed project. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Faculty Travel Grants** are made to participants in professional meetings. Funded by the Geneseo Foundation. Maximum annual awards are \$800 for travel within the

U.S. (excluding Hawaii) and Canada, and \$1,000 for travel to Hawaii or outside the U.S. and Canada.

- **Page Charge** allocations cover the costs of faculty publications in journals with mandatory page charges. Funded by the College.
- The **Hurrell/McNaron Award for Scholarly Presentation** provides a \$1,000 award to an untenured faculty member in support of an outstanding paper delivered at a major conference in the discipline. The award is funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an anonymous donor.

Programs for Students

- **Undergraduate Research and Travel Grants** support student research and conference participation in conjunction with a faculty member. Maximum awards are \$650 per student per semester. Funded by the Student Association and the Geneseo Foundation.
- **Graduate Student Research and Travel Grants** support graduate student research and conference participation in conjunction with a faculty member. Maximum awards are \$650 per student per semester. Funded by the College.
- **The Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes Research Award** supports undergraduate student research or field study. Preference is given to scholarly research combining a natural science and a social science such as biology/sociology or geology/anthropology. The maximum award was \$600 for the 2011-12 year. Funded through the Geneseo Foundation by an endowment established by Dr. Wendell and Barbara Rhodes.
- **Dean Johnston and Geneseo Foundation Student Research Assistantships** provide faculty members with paid research assistants for their scholarly projects. Undergraduate students receive a stipend of \$500. The Dean Johnston Assistantships are funded through an endowment established by CPAC, Inc.
- **Undergraduate Summer Fellowships** provide a \$3,000 stipend for students to undertake a research or creative project under the direction of a faculty member. Students must devote two consecutive summer months to their project. Funded by Follett Higher Education Group and the Geneseo Foundation.


As a National Geographic Explorer and National Geographic's first Archaeology Fellow, Fredrik Hiebert has studied ancient trade across Asia for more than twenty-five years. At a young age he was awarded a citation as a "Future Scientist", however, his interests shifted and he attended Interlochen Arts Academy with a focus on graphic

arts. He became involved in archaeology while studying art in Paris. He completed his doctoral dissertation at Harvard University in 1992, documenting a 4000-year old civilization in the sands of Central Asia. He served as the Dyson Assistant Professor of Anthropology at the University of Pennsylvania before joining the National Geographic Society as Archaeology Fellow in 2003.

Dr. Hiebert began a project in Afghanistan for National Geographic in 2003, which has become famous around the world. Working with curators at the Kabul National Museum in Afghanistan, he led the team that conducted an inventory of the newly-discovered treasures of the museum: art objects and archaeological finds which had been hidden for their protection during a tumultuous decade of civil war. After years of study and archival work, a selection of the objects has appeared as a special National Geographic exhibition around the United States and Europe. Dr. Hiebert curated this exhibition in addition to working to secure the cultural heritage of Afghanistan through advocacy, training, and development of museum resources. This work has inspired his presentation today, "Afghanistan: Cultural Crossroads – Then and Now."
